The Wagners were instrumental in establishing St. Michael's church and school. Because it was difficult for their children to travel the more than three miles to the nearest school... St. Joseph's at Twelfth and Los Angeles streets... the Wagners arranged to have a school built on their property. They later provided the land on which the St. Michael's church was built.
